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<b>PI, Effect of exercise on speech fluency in children who stutter.</b> <i>The purpose of this project is to explore the short-term effects of a bout of exercise on speech fluency in children who stutter (CWS). School-age CWS and children who do not stutter (CWNS) will give a short speech after a bout of exercise on one day and after a sedentary condition on another day. We hypothesize that (a) speech disfluencies (e.g., stuttering and other disfluencies) will be less frequent after an exercise-induced decrease in autonomic arousal and (b) a correlation of this arousal with speech disfluencies. **PI, Autonomic arousal and inhibitory control in preschool-aged children who stutter**

**2011 - 2015**

*Building from the earlier findings of Arnold, Conture, Key and Walden (2011), the proposed research aims to explore the relation of autonomic arousal and inhibitory control to speech disfluency in preschool-aged children who stutter. Three research questions will be addressed: (a) Do preschool-aged children who stutter (CWS) demonstrate less inhibitory control (i.e., the ability to suppress a dominant response) than children who do not stutter (CWNS)? (b) Is use of inhibitory control related to subsequent speech fluency in preschool-aged CWS and CWNS? (c) Is autonomic arousal, elicited through inhibitory control tasks, related to subsequent speech fluency in preschool-aged CWS and CWNS?*
